



2010 Scholarship Application

SCHOLARSHIP CATEGORIES

- A. Must be a high school senior from Midland County that will be attending a school of higher learning.
- B. Freshman, sophomore, junior or senior college student attending any college or school of higher learning. Must be a Midland County resident.
- C. Midland County resident returning to school to pursue certification, associate or a 4-year degree.

SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

- A. Midland County High School Senior (See “A” above)
 - 1. The applicant or his/her parents or spouse must have been a Midland County resident for a period of 12 months or more (proof of residency required.)
 - 2. Grade point average: A minimum GPA of 2.75 (based on 4.0 scale).
 - 3. Financial need: Applicant must be able to demonstrate that he/she or the family is not able to contribute all the funds necessary to pursue a college education. Copy of most current IRS tax return (front page only) is required.
 - 4. Current extracurricular/community activities: Desirable but not essential for selection.
 - 5. Enrollment: Recipient must enroll as a full-time student (12 credit hours or more).
 - 6. Information required: High school transcript and copy of letter of acceptance or proof of enrollment from college/university.
 - 7. Two current typed letters of recommendation (for example from a teacher, employer, clergy or community leader).
 - 8. A typed double-space essay, minimum 2 pages; on your plans for higher education and why you feel the scholarship committee should select your application.
 - 9. **Application and required documentation are due: March 26, 2010 (applications will NOT be accepted after this date.)**
- B. Freshman, sophomore, junior or senior college student attending any college or school of higher learning.
 - 1. The applicant or his/her parents or spouse must have been a Midland County resident for a period of 12 months or more (proof of residency required.)
 - 2. Grade point average: A minimum GPA of 2.75 (based on 4.0 scale).
 - 3. Financial need: Applicant must be able to demonstrate that he/she or the family is not able to contribute all the funds necessary to pursue a college education. Copy of most current IRS tax return (front page only) is required. If not dependent on parents’ tax return, a copy of student’s return must be submitted.
 - 4. Current extracurricular/community activities: Desirable but not essential for selection.
 - 5. Enrollment: Recipient must enroll as a full-time student (12 credit hours or more).

6. Information required: Transcript and copy of letter of acceptance or proof of enrollment from college/university.
 7. Two current typed letters of recommendation (for example from a teacher, employer, clergy or community leader).
 8. A typed double-space essay, minimum 2 pages; on your plans for higher education and why you feel the scholarship committee should select your application.
 9. **Application and required documentation are due: March 26, 2010 (applications will NOT be accepted after this date.)**
- C. Midland County resident returning to pursue Certification, Associate or a 4-year degree.
1. The applicant or his/her parents or spouse must have been a Midland County resident for a period of 12 months or more (proof of residency required.)
 2. Grade point average: A minimum GPA of 2.0 (based on 4.0 scale).
 3. Financial need: Applicant must be able to demonstrate that he/she or the family is not able to contribute all the funds necessary to pursue a college education. Copy of most current IRS tax return (front page only) is required. If not dependent on parents' tax return, a copy of student's return must be submitted.
 4. Current extracurricular/community activities: Desirable but not essential for selection.
 5. Enrollment: Recipient must enroll as a full-time student (12 credit hours or more).
 6. Information required: transcript and copy of letter of acceptance or proof of enrollment from college/university.
 7. Two current typed letters of recommendation (for example from a teacher, employer, clergy or community leader).
 8. A typed double-space essay, minimum 2 pages; on your plans for higher education and why you feel the scholarship committee should select your application.
 9. **Application and required documentation are due: March 26, 2010 (applications will NOT be accepted after this date.)**

SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES – APPLICATION MUST BE TYPED

1. Amount awarded on a yearly basis: One time award ranging from \$500 to \$1,000 for semester specified. Midland College students not to exceed \$500 for semester specified.
2. Awards will be payable to college/university of student's choice upon receipt of acceptance of enrollment. Funds can be applied as needed, towards books, tuition or supplies. No cash disbursements will be given. Scholarship will only be good for the semester specified by applicant.
3. The Midland Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Scholarship Committee will review and select applications based on established criteria and application information. Help can be provided, if needed, to complete application.
4. Scholarship Committee will approve the disbursement of funds.
5. Application and required documentation are due: March 26, 2010 (applications will **NOT** be accepted after this date.) Notification to applicant: May 2010.
6. **If a recipient of a scholarship, a total of 15 community service hours must be fulfilled prior to July 30, 2010. All hours must be completed through the Midland Hispanic Chamber of Commerce.**
